Neuter Nouns of the Second Declension

	Singular		Plural	
Nom.	τὸ ἔργον	the work	τὰ ἔργα	the works
Acc.	τὸ ἔργον	the work	τὰ ἔργα	the works
Gen.	τοῦ ἔργου	of the work	τῶν ἔργων	of the works
Dat.	τῷ ἔργῳ	to, for, by, with, from, the work	τοῖς ἔργοις	to, for, by, with, from the works

NOTE :

1. All Nouns ending in **-ον** are Neuter.
2. Neuter Plural Subjects usually take a singular verb - they behave as if they were singular collective nouns.
